For of such is the kingdom of heaven composed!




M stands for *Modesty*; we should all seek

O is Obedience; let us obey Our parents, who cherish us day after day, As well as our teachers, by whom we are led In the fair paths of learning and wisdom to tread.




P is Politeness, displaying a mind,
